**Self-Initiative:**

A six-year longitudinal study from Tufts University looking at children that participated in 4-H versus other out-of-school-activities found that children who participated in 4-H programs were more likely to contribute to their communities as adults, 1.6 times more likely to have grades of "B" or better in school, 1.2 times more active in physical activity, generally 2.6 times more likely to pursue science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM), and, for young girls, were 1.9 times more likely to pursue STEM education futures.

An additional 2014 study from the University of Minnesota found that 4-H children outperformed their non-4-H peers in math, reading, school attendance, and graduation rates. The study summarized its findings that, "Youth who participate in...4-H programs are on a better course for academic learning starting early in their academic careers than youth who do not participate in 4-H."

While we have never conducted our own research for our clubs, we have witnessed similar outcomes for over 30 years and know that the more opportunities we offer to area youth, the better adults we will produce for our community. We are especially proud that our programs offer equal opportunity for all children, empowering both young boys and girls to achieve success.
